GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) AND CLASS RANK

GPA and rank are based on grades 9-12. All courses for which the student receive an A,B,C,D, or F grade are included in the GPA. A passing grade (P) is not included in the GPA, but will receive graduation credit. If a student repeats a course, both grades are included in the GPA with only one of the courses receiving core credit. All students are included in the class rank according to the simple cumulative GPA.
